#### Infant Room

The first week in Infant Room was a blast! Our classroom theme this year is Space; it was wonderful to watch all the children hunt for stars around the room. The infants loved squishing purple paint between their fingers while painting their own planet. Hayden and Sawyer decided they also wanted to paint their faces! We practiced sharing with our new friends

by passing a foil moon ball back and forth. Sully and Kayla were able to use their gross motor skills to toss the ball high into the air. The youngest of our infants had tummy time in our "moon crater" soft spot. It was a busy and fun week while everyone explored their new room and playground. I'm excited to see what this year will have in store for us!



#### Private Kindergarten News!

Our students have been busy this past month! We are working on review of beginning sounds, identification of upper and lowercase letters, and rhyming words. The children are recognizing word families such as "at/an" and "ug/og". They have learned six sight words and have had a great time playing "Swat the Word" with our colorful swatters. Our writing journals are filled with pictures and a short sentence for each. The children are beginning to read their leveled books during guided reading time and enjoy when we play back the videos of them reading.

Math skills have been presented in many "hands-on" ways this month. We are counting sets, comparing groups, sorting by attributes such as color and size. The children are learning how to write their numerals. We have been writing them with play dough, with dry-erase markers and of course the favorite, writing them in the sand trays. Our I-Pads have been used to practice math skills after the concepts have been introduced.

Our science topic has been "changes and patterns". We explore the weather and calendar daily. We have been experimenting with changes while we follow recipes. We have made homemade banana chocolate chip muffins and cloud dough. These activities encourage our students to count, measure, make predictions and describe a series of sequenced steps.

Our INSPIRED curriculum continues to cover the topic of friendship, tolerance and community. We have read several stories. One of our favorites was, "I Wish I Had Duck Feet". We were able to graph the silly animal parts that we might like to have on our own bodies. This activity made us all laugh!

Play Centers are an exciting part of each day. Some of our favorites are Legos, Bakery, Trains, STEAM bins, Nature Blocks with Animals, Arctic Animals, Magnet Blocks, and Painting. The children have been busy working on collaborating and working together to share the materials.

We are looking forward to many fun-filled days in Kindergarten this year! Ms. Theresa

#### Include Family in Bedtime Stories

Telling stories can be a wonderful part of a bedtime routine. These stories can build imagination, soothe anxieties and create a bond between parents and children. But it's not always easy to think of new story ideas.

Not all stories have to be fantasy. In fact, basing stories on real life can be a great

way to convey a message to your child. For example, you can make the characters' names rhyme with family member's names. Then the characters can relive the events in your family's life together and look forward to the next day's activities.

You can also use the characters to reinforce good behav-

ior. Have them say *please* and *thank you*. Let them see the effects their poor behavior has on others.

This kind of story is a good way to set high expectations. If the story family is going on an outing, the characters can make their parents happy by getting ready on time and not fighting.
