#### Relate Education to Real Life

One of the best ways to help your child do well in school is to connect his education with the world outside of school. In other words, show him how what he learns relates to real life.

To demonstrate that link:

- Point out examples of things your child is studying as they exist around you.
   Visit a museum exhibit or see a movie that relates to a topic he is learning about.
- Talk to your child about your own education and the things it has helped you do. Show him how people can study what interests them and develop careers

- around those ideas. Explain why it is important to explore many subjects at an early age.
- Take a class yourself. Talk to your child about what you are learning and how learning is valuable and continues throughout life. Do your homework in the same room while he does his.

Use your talent or training at the school in a career day or special presentation or just by helping out with an activity or project.
